In response to your correspondence dated November 23, 2022; the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) -International Events and Convention Services Program (IECSP) officially recognizes the following event:

Canadian Elevator Contractors Association (C.E.C.A.) Annual Convention June 13 - 16, 2023 **Halifax Convention Centre** Halifax, Nova Scotia

The information provided to the CBSA states there will be approximately 250 attendees to which 40% are foreign to Canada and that the event is closed to the general public with no sales.

As outlined in your correspondence, this event is expecting approximately 25 foreign exhibitors who are importing elevator and escalator parts and equipment for use at the event.

It should be noted that, non-Canadian exhibitors may import exhibit booths and display items temporarily as outlined in the provisions of tariff classification 9993.00.00 duty free, on the condition that the goods will be exported from Canada upon the completion of the event.

Under certain circumstances, the CBSA may waive the requirement for goods being temporarily imported to be documented on the Temporary Admission Permit (E29B) as well as the posting of a security deposit.

At the time of exportation, goods granted temporary admission on a Form E29B or Carnet must be presented along with importer's/owner's copies of the appropriate documentation to CBSA for verification and certification. This presentation may occur at a CBSA office inland or at the port of export, depending on the circumstances involved and is necessary for you to receive a refund of any securities posted. Please note that the refund is not immediate.

ConsultExpo Event Services has been designated as the official customs broker for this event. If you have any questions regarding importing meeting materials into Canada or if you wish to inquire as to the brokerage services provided, please contact Diane Labbé Deegan at 514-482-8886 ext.2

If your event materials will be imported by a commercial carrier or courier service, a copy of this letter should also be attached to any shipping documents.
